Celebrating—Annual Meeting

Kristin Grissom, the Director of Sun Prairie Parks, Recreation, and Forestry Department, provided an update on the programs and improvements to the parks for 2024 including the new Wetmore Park Shelter, Aquatic Center upgrade planning, and updating the City Parks and Open Space Plan Update and various park master plans.

Celebrating—Frozen Fest 2024



The Friends co-sponsored the City's Frozen Fest Night at the Ice Rink on January 27th. This year the event was held at Stone Ridge Estates Park due to the construction of the new shelter at Wetmore Park. Even though the weather was not optimal, there was a large turnout of folks to share the fire pits, smores, and beverages and to celebrate winter and Jimmy's prediction of more rapidly approaching spring.

In addition to Night at the Ice Rink, Friends board members also participated in the Hibernation Hustle. They finished together even though one was walking and the other 'running'. The week culminated with Jimmy predicting a early spring.



Celebrating—Invasive Removals and Controlled Burn



Sun Prairie Parks Friends continued its efforts to improve the natural environment around Sun Prairie by removing invasive species from selected Parks. In coordination with Sun Prairie Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department (SPPRFD) staff the Friends completed work for now in the Shonas Highlands Park and began efforts in Sheehan Park in a prairie area that was at one time designated a wild flower area. Volunteers undertook the massive effort in the winter months of removing sumac, buckthorn, and other invasive species that had taken over the area.

SPPRFD staff removed the debris and then a controlled burn was conducted in collaboration with the Clty and Pheasants Forever to prepare the area for spring. We will see what comes up from the existing seed beds and then SPPRFD will determine what native seeding is necessary to fully restore the area to a native prairie.

Sun Prairie Parks Friends have been advocating and fund raising for a disc golf course in the city based on input from the community. The City is in the process of updating is the Parks and Open Space Plan this year and disc golf will be on everyone's mind when that plan is updated. However, in the meantime disc golf players need a place to practice their skills locally without having to leave the city. The Friends in collaboration with SPPRF has located a spot in Wyndham Hills Park to construct a practice course for Sun Prairie. The course will consist of three playable and one practice baskets with multiple tee boxes to allow players to practice their skills with a variety of shots. The course is scheduled to be installed in June 2024 and the Open Space Plan which may address a larger facility should be complete later this year.
